- 22.6% of graduates are college ready.**

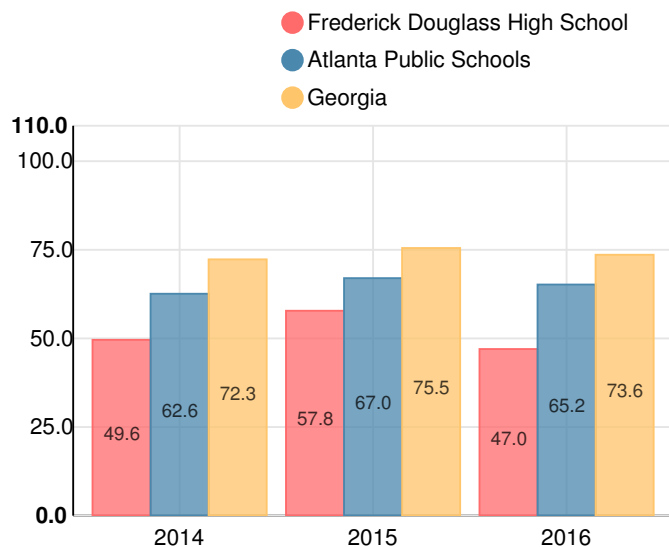

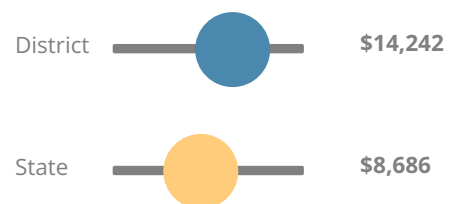

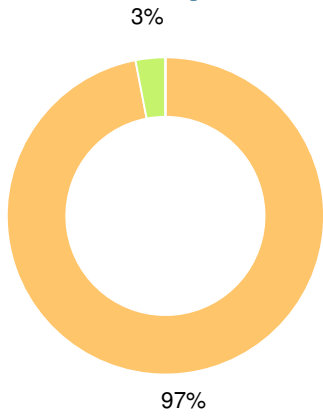


Per Pupil Expenditures



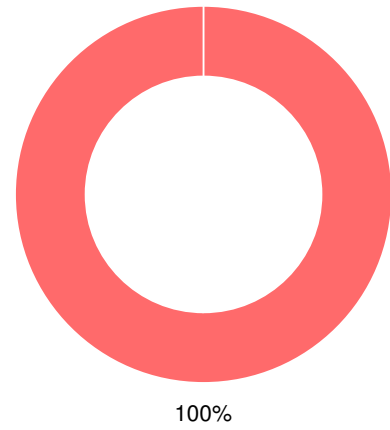

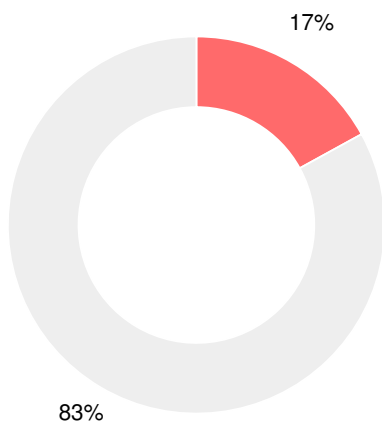

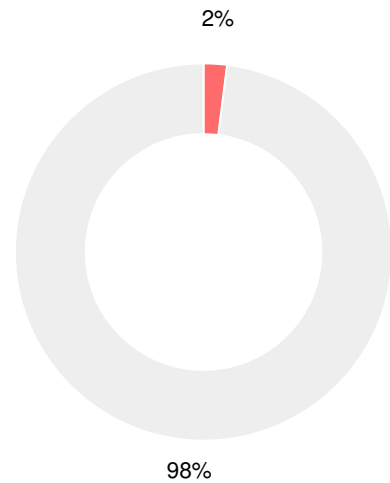

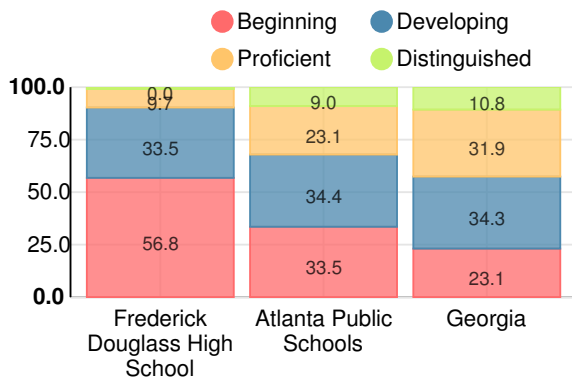

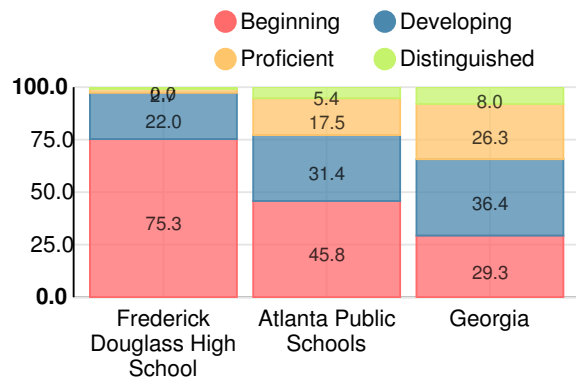
American Literature & Composition

Percent of students scoring in each performance level on 2016 Georgia Milestones



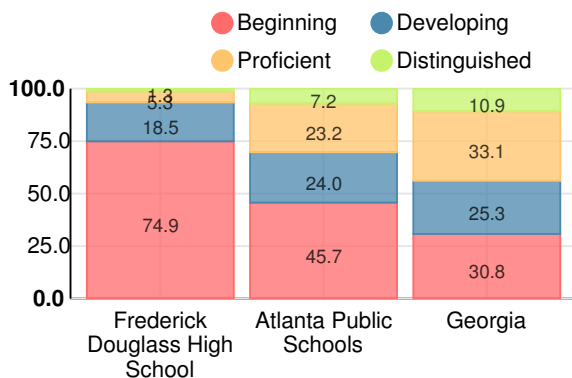
Coordinate Algebra/Algebra I

Percent of students scoring in each performance level on 2016 Georgia Milestones



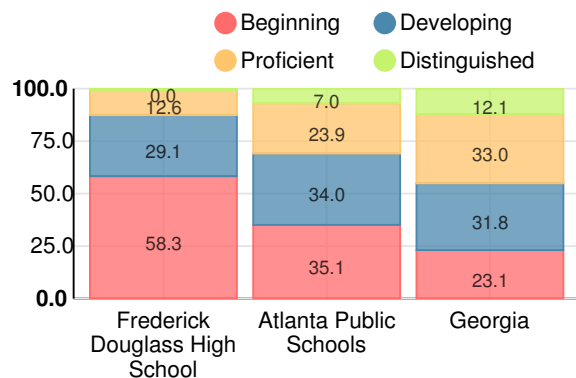
Biology

Percent of students scoring in each performance level on 2016 Georgia Milestones



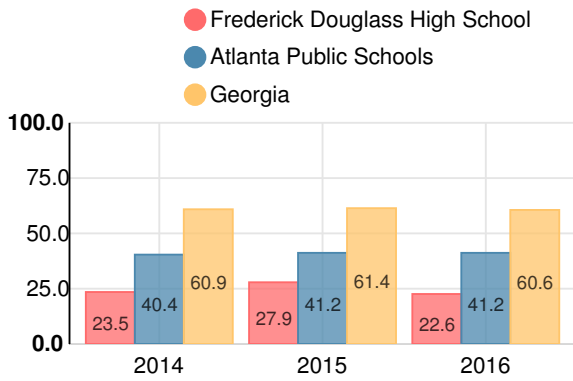
US History

Percent of students scoring in each performance level on 2016 Georgia Milestones



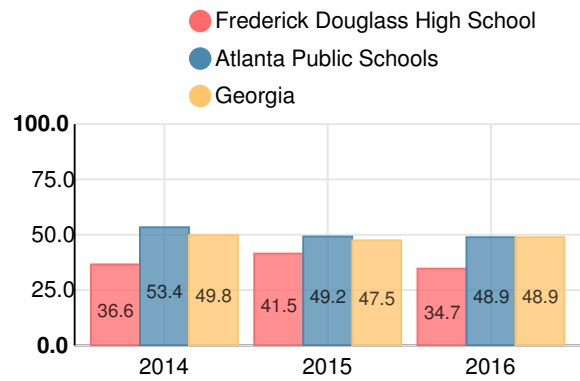
College Readiness

Percent of high school graduates who are college ready

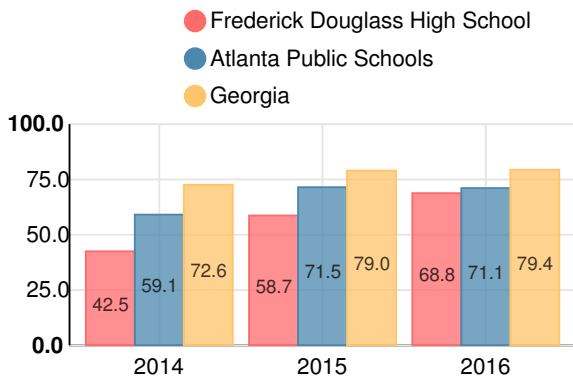


Accelerated Course Taking
